



CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE May 14, 2020

REOPENING STRATEGY REMINDERS

On Friday, May 1, 2020, selected Community Club facilities reopened with limited service offerings and have a number of pre-cautionary measures and practices in place to provide a level of protection for those who choose to use the facilities and to protect our Community Club team members who staff the facilities. It is always your personal decision as to whether or not you feel comfortable using our facilities.

We will continue to follow Federal and State of Tennessee government guidelines to prevent the spread of the virus, with

regards to social distancing, the size of gatherings, and all staff who interact with customers are required to wear face coverings. Also, we have installed portable plastic shields at every customer service location and have posted signs reminding everyone of social distancing recommendations at all facilities. Hand sanitizer will be made available wherever possible. In order to protect our members and our Community Club team, personal interaction will be limited with a continued emphasis on telephone or electronic communication and transactions wherever possible.

The public health guidance regarding group gatherings continues to limit gatherings to a maximum of 10 individuals and continues to stress the importance of maintaining social distancing of six feet between individuals plus encourages the wearing of face coverings. We will continue to follow this guidance both outside on all Community Club property and inside of our facilities.

PHASE II REOPENING CHANGES – Starting week of May 17

Until such time that the public health guidance changes, we will continue to limit gatherings to a maximum of 10 individuals on Community Club property.

F&B:

- Discontinue "To Go" at Legends after Thursday May 21 so we can focus on getting Stonehenge Grille (SHG) ready to reopen ;
- Reopen SHG Sunday May 24 with "Reservations Required" and 50% limited seating both inside and outside for social distancing;
- Hours for SHG will be 8am – 8pm seven days a week with "To Go" orders too;
- Temperatures of staff and COVID-19 questions will be asked daily;
- All staff dealing with customers will wear face coverings;
- We will use disposable condiments so nothing is on the tables;
- Only one party waiting in hallway for a table.

GOLF:

- Only eight people in the pro shop at one time;
- Two golfers per cart if golfers are comfortable doing so;
- Golf groups and leagues allowed to play their games with specific safety rules;
- Golf lessons with social distancing;

RACQUET CENTER:

- All tennis courts will be open for play including Druid Hills;

- Staggered start times will continue for tennis and pickleball to spread play;
- No more than 4 people in pro shop at a time;

MARINAS:

- Boat tours will begin but limited to only those in the same family and all must wear face coverings;

CCC & ACTIVITIES:

- All pickleball courts available at CCC only;

FUTURE ACTIVITY REOPENINGS

FG Library will reopen May 25th with no more than 4 customers in there at a time; hours will be M, W, & F – 9am to 1pm. The remainder of the Library Building will remain closed to group activities at this time.

Timeshare Units will be available for 50% occupancy on June 1st per Mark McClain, Wyndham Resort Manager.

Mini Golf will reopen in early June after some repairs have been completed. Group sizes will be limited to no more than 8 players at a time and players will be required to maintain the recommended six feet of separation with face coverings strongly encouraged.

Farmers Market is tentatively scheduled for returning to The Square on Wednesday, June 10. We will re-evaluate this reopening date contingent upon an increase in the recommended gathering size limit, given that this event has multiple independent vendors and normally attracts groups of individuals larger than the current recommended gathering limit.

Swimming Pools would normally reopen for the season over the Memorial Day weekend. However, the State of Tennessee has decided not to open their State Park public pools for the 2020 season. We are currently investigating what pre-cautionary measures could be taken to re-open our pools safely. At this point no reopening date has been set.

Fairfield Glade respects and adopts the “Tennessee Pledge”

Many of you have asked, “How do you go about determining what actions are included in each phase of the Reopening Strategy and when do you decide to take the next step in the Reopening Strategy?” We have attempted to use the Tennessee Pledge to

guide our decision making process.

The "Tennessee Pledge" is a plan to help Tennesseans return to work in a safe environment, restore their livelihoods and reboot our state's economy.

Part of the pledge states, "COVID-19 is an unprecedented and rapidly evolving threat facing Tennessee and the world. The health and safety of Tennesseans remains our number one priority. Much of our state's current success in this fight is because Tennesseans naturally choose to put each other first and voluntarily adopt safe, new habits. It is that volunteer spirit that has been fighting this pandemic, and it's the same volunteer spirit that will rebuild our economy."

This plan was developed by Governor Lee and the Fairfield Glade Community Club intends to follow this plan. This will be a gradual process, with room to adjust as we evaluate available data and as we observe evolving conditions. Only by working together as a community of volunteers can we successfully reboot our economy—a vital component of our lives, security and liberty—and successfully move past this public health crisis.

Our Governor and Public Health Department are monitoring the spread of the disease as well as several other factors to determine the safest way to eventually return to normal business enterprise.

The Fairfield Glade Community Club Board of Directors is following the lead of both Governor Lee and Cumberland County Mayor Allen Foster in order to return Fairfield Glade businesses and amenities to a near normal status as quickly and safely as possible.

We are considering a number of factors to make decisions regarding the timeline for fully reopening our facilities and amenities but not necessarily limited to the following:

1. We will observe and evaluate what has occurred as a result of the initial reopening process on May 1. The potential damage or exposure will not surface until at least 7-10 days following reopening businesses.
2. The Board will continue to meet telephonically on a weekly basis to determine when and if additional amenities and /or facilities should be reopening.
3. The number of affected people (cases) will be monitored daily through the reporting of Governor Lee and Mayor Foster, especially to see if there are any spikes in confirmed cases. Hopefully the reopening process will not result in an increase in confirmed cases locally.
4. Additional steps in our reopening process will be instituted when

it can be determined that the process so far has not adversely impacted our community in regard to the virus.

5. The health and well-being of our members, residents, visitors, and staff are of utmost importance.

6. We will do everything in our power to balance individual safety and health with a return to economic activity to protect livelihoods as well.

Therefore, we are asking all of you to continue to show good judgment in staying a safe distance from other people and to wear a face covering when appropriate. The Community Club will continue to monitor all relevant factors and will open more access as soon as we can determine that it is prudent to do so.

There is no established timeline for the duration of each Phase of our Reopening Strategy and movement to the next Phase of our strategy will be determined based upon any additional public health advisories or guidance issue and the impact our reopening activities have on our community.

We will continue to re-evaluate our actions as the situation develops, however, we must continue to follow all the public health advisories and we will continue to act in the best interests of our community as a whole.
